

10 Best Travel Companies for Solo Travel Tours in 2025 (*according to TourScoop*)

1. **EF Go Ahead Tours** – focused on social interaction, themes cater to foodies, wellness seekers, adrenaline junkies, and more. Average groups size: 14 to 20 people; Price Range: moderate; What's Included: Guided tours, meals, accommodations, and transportation during the tour; What's Not Included: Airfare; Primary Audience: Adults aged 35+ with a mix of solo, couple, and group travelers; Destinations: Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Australia, Europe, and North, South, and Central America. <https://www.goaheadtours.ca/travel-styles/solo-travel-tours>
2. **G Adventures** – solo-ish Adventures – itineraries intentionally carve out time during the first 3 days to build connections among the group, which is exclusively made up of solo travelers. Roommate pairing is the go-to option but discounted single supplements ease the cost for those who want their own space. Groups are all female-led, partly because 68% of G Adventures' solo travelers are females. One Me Day encourages travelers to explore on their own. Average Group Size: 12-16 people; Price Range: Moderate; What's Included: Accommodations, some meals, guided activities, and arrival transfers. Airfare not included. Primary audience: Adults 30-55; Destinations: Central & South America, Europe, Africa, Asia, the Middle East, and Australia and New Zealand. www.gadventures.com
3. **Exodus Adventure Travels** – leading organized activities for the group – more “obscure” itineraries. Average Group Size: 8 to 16 people; Price range: Upscale; What's Included: Gratuities, sightseeing and admissions, and most meals. Airfare not included; Primary Audience: adults 35 to 65; Destinations: all 7 continents. www.exodustravels.com
4. **Trafalgar** – tours curated for just solo travelers, but accommodations may include a single supplement in lieu of room sharing. Average Group Size: 40-50 travelers, except Africa and Asia are capped off at 20-28. Price Range: Moderate; What's Included: Accommodations, meals, luxury coach transportation, guided activities, and transfers. Airfare not included. Primary Audience: Adults over 50; Destinations: Europe, North & Latin America, Australia & New Zealand, Africa, the Middle East, and Asia. www.trafalgar.com

5. **Intrepid Travel** – more than 50% of their travelers are solo travelers, driven by the company’s mission to preserve indigenous cultures, integrate climate education, and prioritize personal connections with locals. May choose a single room for small extra charge or be paired with another traveler of same gender. Average Group Size: 10 people; Price Range: Economical/moderate; What’s Included: Accommodations, local transport, and some meals. Airfare & travel insurance not included; Primary Audience: Solo travelers and adults age 25-40; Destinations: Europe, Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Central & South America, Antarctica, and Australia.

6. **Abercrombie and Kent** – luxury escorted tours. No dedicated solo trips, but travelers can retreat to your own accommodation at the end of the day. Ongoing promotions, such as 50% on single supplements on select itineraries. Average Group Size: 14 people; Price Range: Upscale; What’s Included: inter-itinerary flights; accommodations, luggage transfers, meals, mid-journey laundry, activities, and expert guides. What’s not included: airfare, though a flight concierge is available 24/7; Destinations: All 7 continents. www.abercrombiekent.com
7. **Wild Frontiers** – trips with British-based company go off the beaten path to destinations such as Tunisia, Pakistan, and Laos. Especially suited to more independent spirits, because about 70% of its travelers are solo travelers. If there is no other single on your tour, you’ll get your own room without paying any supplement. Hotels may not be the most expensive in town, but characteristic of the destination. Meals focus on independently owned eateries. Average Groups Size: 12 people; What’s Included: all accommodations, meals, transport, and entrance fees; Airfare not included; Destinations: Central Asia and China, Europe and the Caucasus, India Subcontinent, Latin America, North Africa and Middle East, Southeast Asia and Pacific, Sub Saharan Africa. www.wildfrontierstravel.com
8. **Road Scholar** – Not-for-profit Road Scholar is the top option for solo seniors and boomers. Approximately 30% of its trip participants are traveling solo, with 85% identifying as female. Two leaders ensure solo travelers feel included in the broader group. Group Size: Limit of 24 people; Price Range: Moderate; What’s Included: Accommodations, most meals, hands-on-experiences, gratuities throughout the program, and Road Scholar Assurance Plan. Airfare not included; Primary audience: Baby boomers and seniors; Destinations: all 7 continents.

9. **CIE Tours** – If Ireland is on your bucket list, they stop here! Partly owned by the Irish government's national rail transport company, CIE offers a discount to solo travelers. Average Group Size: small group itinerary is 26, while standard itinerary is 44. Price Range: Moderate; What's Included: most meals, including daily hot breakfast, all entrance fees to attractions, and all on-tour transportation. Airfare not included. Primary audience: 45 and 70 years old; Destinations: Ireland, Scotland, England and Wales, Italy, Iceland, and Spain. www.cietours.com
10. **Tauck Tours** – does not match singles with roommates, but in an effort to embrace solo travelers, the company has significantly reduced or eliminated single supplements on some land and river cruises. Average Group Size: 35 people; Price Range: Upscale; What's Included: Gratuities, sightseeing and admissions, and most meals; Airfare not included; Primary audience: 50+; Destinations: all 7 continents. www.tauck.com

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
